

Transitioning from operator to business owner came with its share of challenges. "I went from just running the crane to managing everything—paperwork, client meetings, job scheduling, advertising, even mechanical work," he says. "You really have to be ready to wear many hats."

His long-term vision is simple but meaningful: "I want to be known as the Pontiac's reliable, go-to crane service. And one day, I hope my boys might want to be a part of it too."

For him, the most rewarding part has been building something of his own. "I've gained a better work-life balance, and I'm proud to have my name on this business," he shares. "Being close to home has made a big difference for my family."

His business also fills an important local need. "Before, companies had to bring in cranes from out of town, which added to their costs. Now, they can rely on a local service."

Support from SADC Pontiac played a key role in helping him get started. "The SADC has been a huge asset from the start," he says. "I went from just daydreaming about this venture to putting pen to paper and getting the ball rolling. They've been there through it all—helping with business plans, loans, marketing, networking, and even just offering advice. **They've been great to work with and a real support system for local businesses like mine."**

His advice to others thinking about starting their own business? "Don't be afraid to ask questions. In a small community like the Pontiac, there are always people willing to help—and a lot of experience to learn from."

YOUTH STRATEGY LOAN

Personal loans up to \$25 000 for young entrepreneurs aged 18 to 39 years old.

This form of financing has a **leverage effect**, making it easier to obtain additional financing from traditional financial institutions as a young start-up or entrepreneur and is **interest free** for the first 2 years.

The SADC Pontiac is dedicated to supporting rural youth in agricultural entrepreneurship. We provide young entrepreneurs with essential resources, including financial assistance, technical support, and mentorship. Our initiatives focus on fostering innovation, sustainable practices, and business growth, empowering the next generation of farmers to build successful and sustainable agricultural ventures in our community.



CHUTES COULONGE PARK

As part of a service agreement between SADC Pontiac and the Chutes Coulonge Foundation, Brittany Morin has taken on the role of Director General with a focus on improving operations and supporting the park's long-term sustainability.

In this first year, the partnership has already delivered significant results. Several infrastructure and site improvements were completed, and key park equipment was upgraded to improve safety and efficiency. The team launched the first annual Lumberjack Day Festival fundraiser event, while overall revenues increased enough to eliminate the park's previous operating deficit.

Timber-Putt Hockey was built as a new winter offer, allowing the park to remain open year-round for the first time and supporting the creation of two permanent staff positions. These early outcomes demonstrate the value of strategic collaboration in enhancing rural tourism assets and supporting local employment.
