## Chairman's Remarks

Each year, our SADC provides networking opportunities as well as financial, technical and training support to the local business community as we strive to increase the profitability of companies in the Rocher-Percé area.

This presentation of our 2024-2025 annual report, given by our Executive Director, is a testament to the fantastic initiatives put in place during the last 12 months, and I speak for the Board when I say we are very pleased with what we have accomplished.

The past year has also seen the introduction of new policies, specifically a human resources policy, an investment policy, and a collections policy, as well as a five-year plan. The SADC-CAE Network also set a new modern governance project into motion, which I am delighted to be a part of.

I would like to end by thanking our main collaborators, in particular the team at Canada Economic Development and the team at the SADC-CAE Network.

Thank you also to my colleagues on the Board for their contribution, and for sharing both their time and expertise.

## Executive Director's Remarks

2024-2025 was a challenging year, due in large part to ongoing economic instability. Yet we managed to successfully manage the risk of our investment portfolio while maintaining significant client growth. We have found our strength: in being people-centred, in listening, and in working with you. People make all the difference.

I would first of all like to thank our team for its incredible work this year: Roxane, Dominic and Marthe, you listened, supported and adapted to meet the needs of our entrepreneurs with such skill. Your professionalism and care is what has kept us, the SADC, relevant and present, in spite of the complicated economic circumstances.

Our volunteer mentors, such important figures for local development, have continued to create close ties with our community's entrepreneurs. They have supported 12 individuals through one-on-one and group mentoring this year, with group mentoring clearly gaining ground.

As for technical assistance, the Financial Management 101 program continues to be a hit. The third cohort of 18, working with our expert accountants, racked up a whopping 315.5 hours of support in 2024-2025.

For the second year running, our collective financial support for owner-captains in the fishery sector aided many local entrepreneurs, and was even celebrated at the semi-annual SADC-CAE Network event.

None of this would have been possible without our partners: Canada Economic Development, the RCM du Rocher-Percé, Services Québec, Réseau Mentorat, Regroupement des Pêcheurs professionnels du Sud de la Gaspésie, and CBDC Restigouche.

Thank you for believing in our projects, sharing our vision and supporting our work.

In November 2024, we launched a new fund specifically catering to two pressing matters in Quebec's economy: one to support business transfers and the other to accelerate the green and digital transition, both of which are major obstacles to ensuring the long-term future of our local economic fabric.

To everyone who works at the SADC, to the members of our Board, to our partners, and to our business community, thank you for your trust, commitment and enthusiasm for our cause.

Together, we're doing more than simply supporting entrepreneurs, together we are building a sustainable, resilient economy that puts people first.


The SADC's Investment Fund fosters the creation, maintenance and development of job opportunities through complementary financial assistance in the form of loans reaching up to \$300,000.


#### Investment Leverage Effect

# Financing - Youth Strategy Fund






#### Investment Leverage Effect



#### Local Economic Development (LED)

SADC financing contributes to many projects, fostering sustainable development across our territory and the development of our community's entrepreneurs. This stream is covered by our business lines and through mentoring.

\$60,696 invested in 5 projects

#### Technical Assistance (TA)

Made-to-measure guidance, consultancy services and support for companies (including non-profit organizations), covering many spheres of entrepreneurship and business. In 2024-2025, one of the four supported projects was the third cohort of the 101 Project, made up of 18 participants.

\$22,593 invested in 4 projects



#### Financial Management 101

Customizable one-on-one support with an experienced consultant for small business owners and non-profit organizations. Teaches the purpose of financial statements, how to measure financial performance using data, how to compare financial statements with well-established models, and how to track numbers to better manage business overall and analyze projects based on financial data.



## Impact 2024-2025



We conducted two surveys and two focus groups in collaboration with CBDC Restigouche, enabling us to reward the 22 participants with a total of \$6,000. This initiative aimed to obtain a deeper understanding of the realities faced by small and medium enterprises (SME) in Canada's rural and remote communities regarding hiring and supporting employees with mental health issues.






